

Traveling to the venue

The venue is a 20 minute walk or a 5 minute bus ride from the train station, Leiden Centraal. If you prefer to walk, exit the station in the direction of "LUMC/Leiden Bio Science Park" and walk straight ahead, through the medical campus. If you prefer to take the bus, exit the station on the "Centrum" side, and take bus 30/31/38 toward Katwijk or bus 9/183 toward Bio Science Park. Ride the bus to Universiteitsterrein (the second stop), and you will immediately see the Gorlaeus Building, with its sign for "Universiteit Leiden *Faculty of Science*". Room BE0.08 is near the main entrance — on the ground floor, to the right (opposite the café).



Dining recommendations
