

## Copyright: New and Better Reader Agreement

The Reader Agreement defines under which conditions parts of texts and/or images from books and journals can be made accessible for students in readers or in Blackboard without permission of the copyright owner, the so-called “short copies”. Recently, better regulations apply. Prevent costly claims (which come at the expense of your Institute) and adhere to the regulations (the new regulations are in italics, regulations that have expired are crossed out):

- Book (non-fiction): max. 10,000 words AND no more than 1/3rd of the original work (based on the number of pages) *or: max. 50 pages AND no more than 25% of the complete work.*
- Journals (non-fiction): max. 8,000 words, ~~but not more than 1/3 of the volume~~ *OR: max. 50 pages AND no more than 25% of the instalment in question.*
- Literary works: max. 100 lines of poetry or 2,500 words of prose, but no more than 1/10th of the complete work (unchanged regulation).
- *Sheet music, a song text: max. 1 couplet and 1 chorus; music: max. 5 note bars.*
- Images: graphs, tables, diagrams, photographs, and illustrations: max. 25 figures from the same original work. ~~1 graph etc. is counted as 200 words.~~ *If a graph or illustration is copied as part of a text, the image counts for 200 words.*
- *Raw government publications and case law are exempted from copyright. This applies to case law in its original form, as it was made available by the court. So this does not apply to verdicts collected and published by a publisher. The same goes for legislation: only legislation from the Staatscourant, the Staatsblad, and the Tractatenblad can be freely copied in Blackboard.*
