The Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values programme provides funding for citizens engagement, equality for all and the implementation of rights and EU values. The Citizens, Equality, Rights and Values programme (hereafter 'the programme') brings together the former Rights, Equality and Citizenship programme3 and the former Europe for Citizens programme4. The programme promotes exchanges between people of different countries, reinforces mutual understanding and tolerance and gives them the opportunity to broaden their perspective and develop a sense of European belonging and identity through networks of towns

EU-Funding: Citizen's engagement and participation (political science)

This call aims to support projects promoted by transnational partnerships and networks directly involving citizens. These projects will gather a diverse range of people from different backgrounds and genders in activities directly linked to EU policies, giving them an opportunity to actively participate in the EU policymaking process and thus contribute to the democratic and civic life of the Union. The projects will encourage citizens', including young persons, understanding of the policymaking process, showing in practice how to engage in the democratic life of the EU and enabling them to make known and publicly exchange their views in all areas of Union action.

KIC Values in Transition(s) (open to all disciplines)

Society faces many transitions, like the move towards a circular economy, the protein transition, combating climate change and digital resilience. This call aims to contribute to accelerating, scaling up and making transitions more inclusive, resulting in broad welfare and multi-value creation. Deadline: 30 January 2025

Take Off phase 1 - Feasibility studies WO Spring 2025 (open to all disciplines)

Enterprising scientists who want to investigate whether it is feasible to commercially apply an innovative research result can apply for funding via Take-off phase ${\bf 1}$ - Feasibility studies WO. This program is aimed at stimulating and supporting economic activity and entrepreneurship on the basis of science.

KIN Pact Network Grant (open to all disciplines)

Are you working with your network on a climate transition and are you looking for (financial) support to properly start or professionalize your network? Or would you like support in setting up a transdisciplinary climate transition network? This call might be for you!

<u>Long-term Europe-Africa WEF Nexus (LEAWEF) Multilateral Research Programme</u> (open to several disciplines)

This call for proposals is the first call launched within LEAWEF Programme. It invites broad consortia that cooperate in impact-driven research projects on the Water-Energy-Food (WEF) Nexus, which addresses the interlinkages, synergies, and trade-offs between the management, production and consumption chain of water, energy and food resources.

NWA Science Communication 2025 (open to all disciplines)

The call 'NWA Science Communication' funds science communication projects that aim to strengthen the connection between science and society. For example by offering new science communication concepts to target groups without obvious links with science.

SSH Open Competition XS 2025 - round 1 (open to all disciplines)

Open Competition XS is the funding programme for ideas that hold great promise. The SSH-XS grants are available for projects with a maximum budget of 50,000 euro to enable proposals for curiosity-driven, innovative research in the research fields covered by the NWO Domain SSH. The Call for proposals of 2025 has 3 rounds.

Research into Collections with a Colonial Context (CADS)

Researchers from organisations in countries of origin (including the autonomous countries in Kingdom of the Netherlands and the special municipalities) of objects and collections with a colonial context in Dutch museums may apply for a short-term research exchange grant or a larger consortium grant to create a sustainable research network. This is the second round within this research programme.

Deadline: 6 March 2025

Open Science: Replication Studies (CWTS)

Researchers working at a Dutch knowledge institution can apply for funding to replicate "cornerstone research" in all disciplines from NWO and ZonMw.

Deadline full application: 6 March 2025

Cities Amidst Climate Change: Enhancing Physical and Social Resilience in Urban Areas (CADS)

The call "Cities Amidst Climate Change" provides funding for Dutch-Chinese consortia to conduct research into improving physical and social resilience in urban areas. Consortia work together to investigate practical measures to address the impact of climate change, with the aim of making cities more resilient to future challenges.

Deadline: 11 March 2025

NWO-Talent programme Vici SSH 2025 (open to all disciplines)

Vici is part of the NWO Talent programme. The Vici target group consists of researchers at the stage of consolidation and further development of their leadership/research group.

Deadline pre-proposal: 11 March 2025 Deadline full application: 9 September 2025

SPRONG Technology for Staffable Care (psychology)

With SPRONG Technology for Staffable Care, the Taskforce for Applied Research SIA wants to bring together and strengthen applied research, acquired knowledge and experience related to the application of technology in healthcare in a multidisciplinary SPRONG research group. A SPRONG group has the potential to develop into a powerful research group within an eight-year period and consists of a collaboration between (at least) two universities of applied sciences and practice partners, such as companies from professional practice, public institutions and governments.

<u>Demonstrator 2025</u> (open to all disciplines)

Researchers who want to apply knowledge from their research and bring it to the market can apply for funding from NWO to further develop this knowledge into a demonstrator. In a Demonstrator project, all preparatory activities are carried out that are necessary to transfer the underlying demonstrator knowledge to a third party.

Deadline: 18 March 2025

Rubicon 2025-1 (open to all disciplines)

Rubicon aims to encourage talented researchers who recently received their PhD to spend some time at research institutes outside of the Kingdom of the Netherlands to further their scientific career.

Deadline full application: 25 March 2025

KIC Long-term programmes (open to all disciplines)

NWO invites researchers and partners to organise consortia that will set out to do innovative research and develop solutions for societal issues, while realising economic potential, to submit an application for a long-term programme. Long-term programmes aim towards impact throughout the course of the programme, as well as lasting beyond the funding period.

NWO Call Participation of people with a brain and/or mental disorder in education and employment (psychology)

This Call for proposals calls on knowledge institutions and societal stakeholders to jointly develop scientific and practice-oriented research proposals aimed at aimed at advancing participation for people with brain and/or mental disorders in education and (un)paid work, specifically on the transition between these domains. The consortia are interdisciplinary and knowledge chain-wide composed and work in a disorder-transcending and integrated manner.

NWA Key Enabling Methodologies (KEM's) - The utilization of Key Enabling Methodologies in complex societal transition issues (open to several disciplines)

The consortia work multi- and interdisciplinary and are knowledge chain-wide.

Towards a new labour market in 2050: Energy transition and digitalization in the built environment (open to several disciplines)

This call is focused on developing knowledge on what the labour market of the built environment will look like in 2050. This research provides insight into the future-oriented challenges posed by the digital and energy transitions to the labour market of the built environment. Insights and knowledge from this call should contribute to the development of a future framework for the labour market of the built environment.

News

The Academy regards awards as an important means of showcasing outstanding and promising researchers. They also serve to spotlight specific areas of research and/or the arts. In addition, the Academy runs a number of incentive programmes specifically meant to encourage research excellence, in particular among young scientists

and scholars. The Academy offers several awards and funding possibilities.

NIAS - one of the institutes of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences (KNAW) – has made it its mission to provide a physical and intellectual space for advanced research in the humanities and social sciences that is driven by curiosity and cross-discipline collaboration.

KNAW Early Career Partnerships (for all disciplines)

Postdoctoral researchers at the beginning of their careers can apply for up to EUR 10,000 to organise an interdisciplinary meeting in the Academy's Trippenhuis complex or another location of their choice. Deadline: 3 February 2025

Institute Gak-KNAW Award (for all disciplines)

Talented early-career researchers may apply for a three-year appointment as a post-doc researcher at an Academy institute to conduct research on the labour market and social security in the Netherlands. Deadline: 14 February 2025

NIAS Individual Fellowship (for all disciplines)

NIAS offers individual fellowships to scholars who wish to carry out independent research in the humanities and the social sciences. For five or ten months, scholars are offered time and space to work on their own research project as part of an interdisciplinary community.

Deadline: 17 March 2025

NIAS Theme Group Fellowship (for all disciplines)

A NIAS Theme Group is an (international) team of two to four researchers working together on a specific research topic for five consecutive months. Each researcher pursues their individual project while also contributing to collaborative team research. SICCS-ODISSEU Summer School 2025 (for all disciplines)

In this summer school, ODISSEI will bring together PhD students, post-docs and early career researchers interested in computational social science. Proposals must focus on supplying education for gifted and talented high school students.
